Guidelines for Parents/Guardians

- 3) They should encourage their wards to cultivate cleanliness in his/her work and person. Dress him/her neatly and properly.
- 4) Children's complaint, if any, may be brought to the notice of Headmistress.
- 5) Parents should not visit their wards or teachers during school hours.
- 6) They should not allow their wards to bring costly things to school.
- 7) They should check the school diary of their wards regularly and to be signed below the notes/remarks.
- 8) They should attend the PTM regularly to get first hand feedback on the general progress of their wards. Students must accompany the parents for the PTM.
- 9) Parents are requested to notify the school immediately if any change is there in their address / phone number.
- 10) Fix regular study hours for your ward at home. Please co-operate and instruct your ward to abide by the regulations of the school.

SCHOOL INFORMATION

SCHOOL RULES

Code of Conduct, dress and Behaviour

- 1) Every student should bring his/her diary to school regularly.
- 2) At the first bell the student must fall in line for the assembly with their school diary/ song book and return silently to their classrooms.
- 3) Running or shouting in the corridor is not permitted. The students must walk in silence when they move to playground, computer lab etc.
- 4) The name, class and section of the pupil should be clearly marked on all the belongings of the student.
- 5) Ornaments of Gold, Silver, Expensive watches and mobile phones are not to be brought to school. The school will not be responsible for any loss or damage.
- 6) Students are accountable to the authorities for their behaviour, both within the school and outside the campus.
- 7) Use of any abusive language in the school premises, in the bus, in the playground or anywhere will be seriously dealt with.
- 8) Students should take care of school property. They should not write or put scratches on desks, chairs, walls etc.
- 9) Any indiscipline in the bus by the students is liable to be punished.

- 10) A student not willing to continue bus service must report to the office one month in advance for the cancellation.
- 11) Remarks made in the school diary should be countersigned by the parents.
- 12) Students should come to the school in proper uniform on all working days.
- 13) Girls should not apply nail polish / mehndi when they come to school. Girls with long hair should plait their hair on two sides and use yellow/Brown/house coloured hair bands.
- 14) Summer Uniform will commence from 1st April of the new session and Winter Uniform from 1st November onwards.
- 15) Any change of residence must be notified in writing to the school office.
- 16) All students must speak in English in the class and the school premises. English conversation must be encouraged.
- 17) Students should bring their tiffin, water bottle with them.
- 18) Any indiscipline or negligence will be given a black star. Three black stars will lead to the disciplinary action.

School Term and Attendance

The Academic session commences from April 2017 to March 2018. The first term from April to October and the second term from November to March.

- 1) Regular attendance is compulsory.
- 2) Students should be in the school at least five minutes before the first bell. Late comers will be sent home.
- 3) In case of absence, a prior application from parent to be submitted.
- 4) No student shall be allowed to leave the school during class hours unless, a written note from parent reaches the authority in advance.
- 5) Leave on medical grounds for more than two days shall be supported by a medical certificate.
- 6) Continuous absence from school for more than ten consecutive days without granting leave will entail removal from rolls.

Library Rules

- 1) Students are advised to make the best use of the library.
- 2) Within seven days, the students should return the book issued.
- 3) Student found writing with pen/pencil in the library book, tearing, scratching or mishandling of the book is liable to be penalized.

Admission and Withdrawal

- 1) Registration for Preschool will begin in the month of January. Forms will be available in the school office.
- 2) An attested photocopy of the birth Certificate, Municipal/Panchayat must be produced with the registration form. Date of birth once registered will not be altered.
- 3) Students seeking admission for Prep-VIII will be Selected on the basis of Evaluation.

- 4) Admission will be confirmed only on the submission of T.C. from the school last attended and progress report of the school.
- 5) One month's notice must be given in writing by the parent before the withdrawal of their ward.
- 6) Notice for withdrawal cannot be given during holidays. A student who is withdrawn in April/May must pay the summer vacation fee.
- 7) Transfer Certificate will be issued only after getting clearance from the office.
- 8) EWS:- As per Government rule.

Fee Regulations

- 1) Fee shall be accepted upto 14th of every quarter without fine. In case 15th happens to be a holiday, 13th will be the last date for payment of fees.
- 2) A fine of Rs. 100 will be charged from 15th onwards recurring monthly.
- 3) The name of the defaulter for two quarters will be struck off from the rolls. The student may be re-admitted at the discretion of the Headmistress on payment of all the arrears and admission fee.
- 4) Parents have the option to deposit the fees for the whole term/year in advance, if they find it more convenient.
- 5) All fees are payable in advance for all the quarters.
- 6) Except caution deposit, fees once paid will not be refunded.
- 7) The result will be withheld for the fee defaulters.
- 8) Outstation or Post Dated Cheques are not acceptable. Any dishonoured cheques by the bank will be treated under category of non-payment of fees and the person will have to pay Rs. 200/- per student as bank charges.
- 9) Cheques duly crossed should be drawn in favour of "ST. PAUL'S JUNIOR SCHOOL"(for Nur & Prep) and "ST. PAUL'S SCHOOL"(for class 1 onwards). Student's name, Class, Admission no. should be written on the reverse of the cheque.
- 10) Fees can be paid by cheque/cash from 1st to 15th of every quarter without fine.
- 11) Fee defaulters will not be allowed to sit for the assessment tests.
- 12) Parents are advised not to send cash through their wards or any employee of the school.
- 13) One month notice in writing is required before a child discontinues the school. Otherwise one month's fee will be levied.
- 14) Parents are requested to keep the receipt of the fee book issued to them. They may have to produce them, if required to do so.

School Uniform

- 1) The pupil must change their uniforms every day.
- 2) Students should be neatly dressed in full uniform.(Belt and I-Card compulsory).
- 3) Students should wear House Uniform on Wednesdays.
- 4) Students are allowed to wear casual wear on their birthdays.
- 5) Checking of proper uniform will go on very strictly. No student, during school time, shall enter the campus without proper uniform.

Scheme of Examination and Promotion

The Academic year is divided into two terms, April to October and November to March. There will be a system of Continuous Evaluation throughout the year where in the cognitive as well as non-cognitive learning outcomes of the activities conducted are assessed for promotion to next class. Grades are awarded on the basis of the performance in the Periodic Test, Term Exams, Oral Test, Dictation, Project Works and assignments.

Instruction regarding the Periodic Test / Term Exams (Nursery to V)

- 1) Assessment will be done on the basis of Periodic Tests and the two term end examinations.
- 2) The Maximum marks will be 30/60 per Test. The time allotted for the test is 45/90 minutes. Notebooks and Subject Enrichment Activity (SEA) will be marked out of 5 marks each in both terms. There will be three tests for a subject in a term. The maximum marks for a subject in a term will be 100 marks.
- 3) Answer sheets will be provided for the Assessment (III-V). The question cum answer sheet will be provided for Class I and II. The answer sheet will be shown to the parent during the PTM.
- 4) There will be an exam for the graded subjects in the first term and the second term. Test dates for MSc, GK, Drawing, Computer and Phy. Ed. are given in the diary.
- 5) Please note that every test is important and the student should not remain absent for it.
- 6) If a student is absent for any Periodic Test, no re-test will be conducted and no marks will be awarded for the same.
- 7) Internal Assessment will be done on the following criteria-Class work, Homework, Discipline, Attendance, sincerity, class response, class behavior, submission of assignment and project work, spoken English, punctuality, neatness(Uniform, hair, nails, polished shoes, personal hygiene.)
- 8) Apart from the scheduled tests, the usual surprise test, revision test etc. will be conducted.
- 9) The syllabus for a particular test will be the portions covered after the previous test. Apart from this if any topic is to be included in the test it will be mentioned in the diary with date.
- 10) If there is any unforeseen/emergency holiday on the test day, it will be held on the next working day.

School is introducing Periodic Tests as well as Term end examination for classes VI-X in keeping with the requirements of CBSE.

EXAMINATION AND EVALUATION

- 1) Students are required to appear for all the Periodic Tests / Term Exams during the year.
- 2) In case of absence due to illness, a Medical Certificate will be required.
- 3) Periodic tests will be of 10 marks each and end term exams will be of 80 marks. The final term will cover 100% of the syllabus of the academic year.
- 4) Students are required to secure at least 33% in each subject to be promoted to next class.
- 5) Students will be awarded both marks and grades for their performance.
- 6) Students using unfair means during the Periodic tests and term end examinations will be marked zero in the subject. These students will not be eligible for any academic awards or school appointments.

CRITERIA FOR PROMOTION

Promotion will be granted on the basis of whole year's performance of the student in the Periodic Test and the Term end examination which is a system of evaluation of student that covers all aspects of student development. Our main aim is to provide holistic profile of the learner through regular assessment of both scholastic as well as co-scholastic areas.

- 1) **Scholastic areas include:** Periodic Tests and term end exams. Each term will have two periodic tests and one term end exam.
- 2) **Co-scholastic activities include:** Work education, art education, discipline, performing skills and clubs. Health and physical education will also form an integral part of this assessment.

The above will be evaluated and graded. The session will be spread over two terms April 2019 to September 2019 and second from October 2019 to March 2020. Assessment will be both, Periodic tests and Term End Examination.

Periodic Tests will be carried out in between the I Term and II Term.

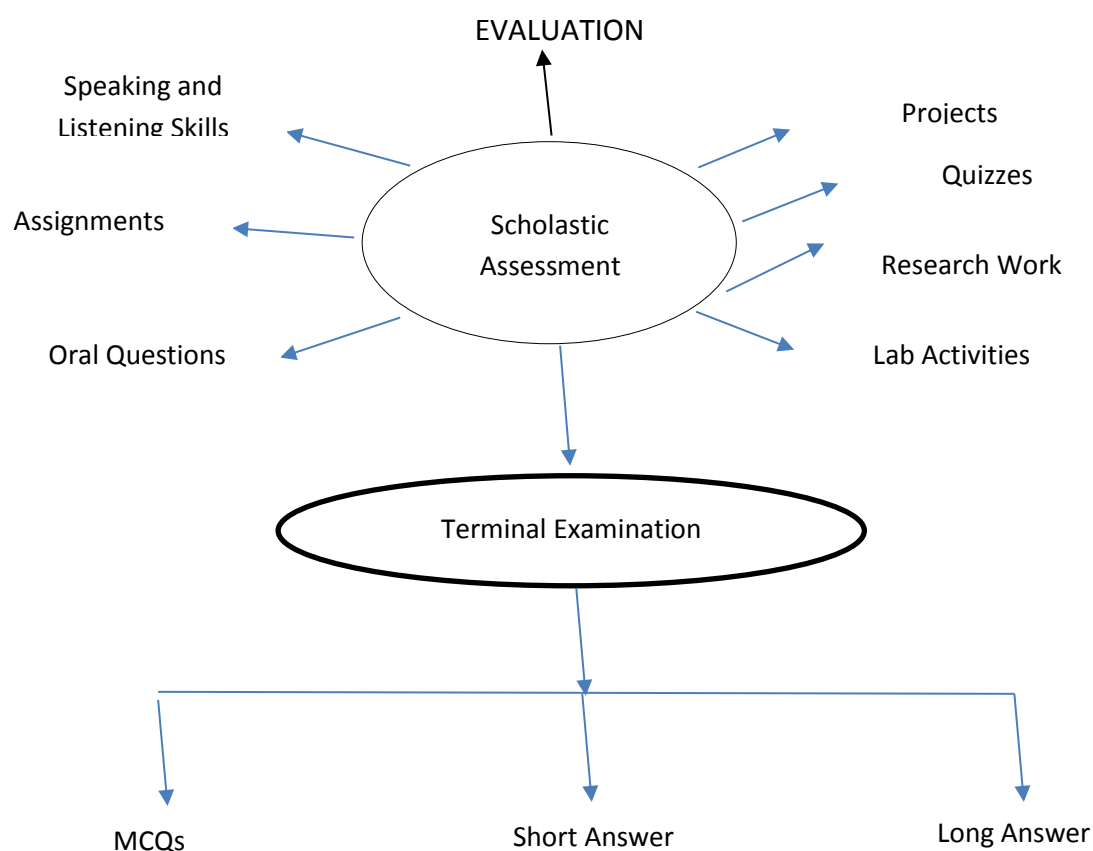

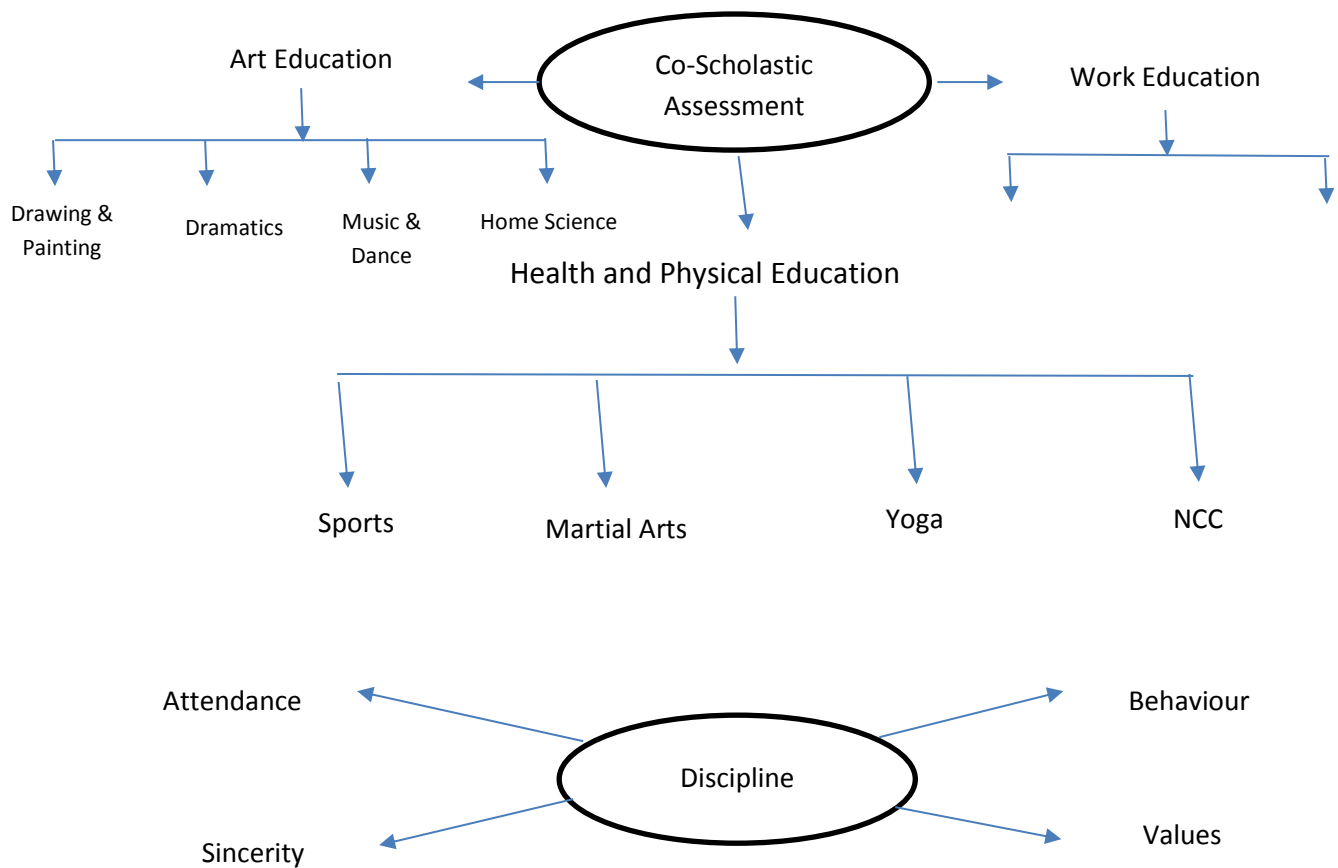
Operational Modalities
